Power of the Pen



The KMS Quiz Bowl team competed Saturday at the 1st Tag Team Quiz Bowl event at Crestview Schools in Conway, Ohio. The team was split into 3 teams; Kenton Wildcats, Kenton Red, and Kenton White. They played 10 rounds against 14 other teams from Crestview, Fort Recovery, Coldwater, Continental, Delphos, St. Marys and Van Wert. The Kenton Wildcats: Lucas Hites, Owen Styer, Aidan Carlson and Ace Baum; were in first, second, or third place for most of the rounds ending in third place overall with 196 points. The Kenton Red: Trenton Yoder, Grace Collins, Katie Sturgeon, Caleb Mackenzie and Seth Dunahue were 16th out of 17th scoring 19 points in round 10 and a total of 36 points total. The Kenton White: Taylor Harshfield, Lauren Bartlett, Max Haushalter, Addy Modd and Jacob Taylor were 14th scoring 14 points in their best round and 53 points overall. Everyone on all 3 teams rang in and answered questions correctly and several members swept their categories for bonus points.
